ABOUT THE OPPORTUNITY

SKOL is seeking an emerging 2SLGBTQIA+ graphic designer based in Montréal to imagine and develop the visual identity of SKOL's 2026 queer-focused season.

This is a paid mentorship. SKOL will provide a 2 000 CAD design fee for the emerging designer and facilitate a supportive mentorship context throughout the creative process, in partnership with a graphic design studio. We're looking for a fresh, playful, experimental approach that celebrates gueer communities in Québec, past and present.

DIGITAL DELIVERABLES

- Seasonal announcement (January 2026)
- Graphics for the four exhibition cycles of the season
- Social media posters and reusable templates (per exhibition and artist announcement)
- Newsletter assets for the season

PRINT DELIVERABLES

- One poster for the 2026 season
- Four exhibition posters (one per exhibition)
- Four booklets (shared template adapted per exhibition)
- Exhibition graphics



DESIGN DIRECTION

The selected designer may propose either:

- One cohesive identity for the season, adapted per exhibition; or Four distinct looks (one per exhibition) with strong visual cohesion and longevity across the season.
- The overall approach should be playful, celebratory, and experimental.

- January 15: Public launch of SKOL's 2026 queer season

ELIGIBILITY

- Early-career independent graphic designer
- Based in Montréal
- Identifies as part of the 2SLGBTQIA+ community
